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Sikkim Government B.Ed. College – A profile.

Traditionally, 'Teacher' was regarded as the Oracle and the transmitter of Knowledge, but now there is a paradigm shift as regards to his/her role in the field of teaching. In the 21st century, teachers are expected to invent new horizons of knowledge and help student to keep pace with the change of time. Therefore, the role of teacher today, is of paramount importance.

Teachers are the edifice atop which the entire Education System stands. Therefore, to make the Educational Pyramid strong, strengthening teacher education is a must. Besides, reform and success of school education depends largely on the quality of the teachers. So, to equip the teachers with the present trends of handling the school curricula and help keep pace with the explosion of knowledge, the institute like B.Ed. has been initiated.

Government B.Ed. college, under HRDD was established in 2009 and became operational from 2010 onwards. The Institute is located in Soreng, one of the Sub-divisions of West district of Sikkim. The college has its own land with an area of 2.00 hectares. Presently , two blocks of buildings are constructed in the complex. Each block is set up in a built up area of 682.5 and 744.39 sq mtrs. respectively.

The upper block, where the B.Ed. course is presently housed, has good infrastructure with spacious classrooms, laboratories, library, lounge, office of the Principal, office for the administrative staff, separate rooms for teaching faculty, seminar hall, exam room ,computer lab. Smart classes etc.

The college is recognized by NCTE (National Council of Educational Research and Training)vide O.O No:ERC/7-102 (25) 1/2009/2062 dated 19.11.2009 and is affiliated to Sikkim University.

II. Note on School Internship:

- (i) School Internship will conducted in Semester – III and Semester – IV

Semester - III

(ii) **Pre-Internship:**

It will involve the following activities for a period of **two weeks**.

- (a) *Demonstration Lessons:* The teacher educator of the concerned method subject will present demonstration lesson for the method subject and each student teacher shall observe **two** demonstration lessons of their respective method subjects and submit the report.
- (b) *Micro Teaching Practice:* Each student teacher will undergo micro teaching practice session for **five teaching skills** in each subject under the supervision of concerned teacher Educator. This should be followed by **two lessons** on Integration of Skills.
- (c) *Macro Teaching Practice:* Each student will undergo Macro Teaching Practice session for two lessons in each subject under the supervision of concerned Teacher educator. The work performed during the pre- internship shall be evaluated internally by the concerned teacher educator on the basis of reports submitted.

During pre-internship, student teachers will also pay visit to their allotted practicing school and interact with school teachers & principal to acquire firsthand knowledge of School's academic environment and submit the report.

Semester - IV

(iii) Internship

During internship each student teacher will be attached with a particular school for a period of **fourteen weeks** where they will undergo teaching practice in the actual classroom by delivering **60 lessons (30 in each method subject)** under the supervision of concerned teacher educator. The observation report of 30 lessons should be submitted for evaluation. Teaching aids is compulsory for teaching of each lesson.

(iv) Post Internship

At the end of the teaching practice a student teacher will present **two criticism lessons on two method subjects** to finally demonstrate her/his teaching competency which will be evaluated by the concerned teacher educator towards his internal assessment. It will spread over **two weeks**.

School Internship, besides teaching practice, will involve school related works as a part of their training. The same are given as below:

- a. Teacher 's Diary
- b. Preparation of Time Table
- c. Addressing School Assembly

III. Final Examination of Internship (External)

The final external examination of School Internship will be conducted by a four member B. Ed. - Internship Examination committee constituted by the University wherein a student –teacher will demonstrate her/his teaching competency by presenting her/his teaching lesson in a school classroom (for at least one method subject) which will be followed by a viva-voce on teaching practice and all other aspects of school internship.

Admission Procedure:

1. Total intake: - 150.

Distribution of seats:

Distribution of seats will be as follows:-

1. In-service candidates: 10 (GTs & PGTs)
2. Applicants from outside state: 20
3. Differently able candidate: 03
4. Remaining 117 seats will be distributed as per pro rata & the number of applications received by the college from each district.

In case of unfilled seats by the candidates in any of the above category will be allotted to other candidates who are merit in waiting.

Eligibility Criteria.

Candidate with graduate or Post graduate degree with following percentage can apply:

1. SC/ST: 45%. Marks in aggregate.
2. OBC: 47%. Marks in aggregate.
3. General : 50% Marks in aggregate.

In case of in-service candidates, any Graduate or Post Graduate, working as either Primary Teacher / Graduate Teacher /Post Graduate Teacher is eligible for admission, provided he/she has secured the percentage of marks as stated above. Relaxation, if any is strictly governed by the NCTE Notifications issued from time to time.

The conditions as above shall also apply to language Teachers/Monastic Teachers who seek admission as in- service candidates.

Selection procedure:

Selection shall be made on the ***merit basis*** of marks obtained in the qualifying examination and in the entrance examination. Weight age to marks shall be taken as follows.

1. 60% from Entrance Examination.
- 2.40% from the marks obtained in the Graduation/Post graduation Examination.

(Candidate should have school Teaching Subject at the Graduation/post graduation level. Candidate with vocational subject/IT /other technical courses will not be eligible for admission to B.Ed. College.

Library:

The College Library is fairly equipped with text books, reference materials, magazines, and periodical educational journals.

There are separate seating arrangements for students and Faculty Members for browsing through or study. There is a large and spacious reading area for the students.

In the Library, all students must maintain perfect silence and discipline. The students are to possess Membership Card in order to avail of the facilities of the Library. Library and Identity cards are to be renewed after successful completion of each semester.

Laboratories

Available laboratories in the B.Ed. College are as follows:

1. Science Lab.
2. Geography Lab.
3. Language Lab.
4. Maths Lab.
5. Psychology Lab.

Each student is expected to abide by the following rules strictly.

1. Books shall be issued only to the bonfires students of the College.
2. Every student is entitled to borrow only two books at a time.
3. Books have to be returned on or before the last date mentioned on the Due Slip.
4. Books are issued for 15 days only. However, the same may be renewed depending on the availability of copies in the library.
5. A fine of Rs 10/- per day shall be levied for delay in returning the books.
6. Books must be handled with care.
7. Students must not write any remark on the pages or mutilate any page. Students should check the book before receiving from the Library.
8. If a book is lost or damaged, it must be replaced by paying double the cost of the lost or damaged book.
9. Reference books, Periodicals journals, Encyclopaedias, dictionaries and atlases are not issued. Students and Faculty Members have to use them in the Library itself.

10. Students must produce their Identity card /Library Card on demand by the Librarian for availing of the facility of using reference materials, previous year question papers, syllabus, etc.
11. Xerox machine is installed for students and faculty for printing purpose on payment basis.

College rules and regulations.

For smooth and effective functioning of the college, students shall abide by the following rules and regulations .If any rules are violated, appropriate action shall be initiated against students who are found to be guilty of violating the college rules and regulations.

1. Boy Students are to maintain proper hair cut and not allowed to wear ear rings during college time.
2. Girl Students are not permitted to come to college wearing pants.
3. It is compulsory for the students to attend functions or activities organized by the college on various occasions, in proper college uniforms, whether the function falls on a working day or on holidays unless notified otherwise. Absence from such functions without valid reasons will invite disciplinary actions.
4. Students are prohibited to take part in ragging, political activity or any activity which is detrimental to the dignity of the college. Any students found violating the rule or bringing disrepute to the college will be expelled from the college.
5. The students will compensate damage to college property or furniture caused by neglect or willful damage. Defacing the walls or college property will be viewed seriously.
6. Students must make all possible efforts to conserve electricity and water. They must switch off lights when they leave the classrooms, seminar room, laboratory etc.Students must help to keep the college neat and clean, also preserve and maintain the garden.
7. Students must keep their identity card always with them and shall show the same on demand by any faculty or official of the college.
8. Any students found smoking or under the influence of intoxication of alcohol/ drugs in the college are liable to strict disciplinary action which may be up to expulsion from the college.
9. College has set up different Committee for the smooth functioning of the college.

10. Students will carry out the orders of the Principal and the Committee members. They shall be directly answerable to the Principal for their behaviors in general and their conduct in particular within the College premises .
11. Students shall behave politely with the Principal and the Staff of the college. They will also behave cordially with the fellow students.
12. Any act of disobedience, improper conduct or indecent remark, writing of objectionable posters etc. will be viewed seriously and strict action will be initiated so as to check the recurrence of such behaviors.
13. Students should ensure that they use classrooms, common rooms, furniture, laboratory, library books and all other college properties with utmost care .
14. The cost of any damages done will be recoverable from the students either individually or collectively as the case maybe.
15. Students are expected to collect all the required information displayed on notice boards from time to time.
16. Change in local or permanent address of students should be immediately initiated to the college office in writing.
17. No money shall be collected for any purpose whatsoever, without prior permission of the Principal.
18. Students will not hold any meeting or get-together in the college premises without the prior approval of the principal and the Committee members.
19. Smoking, gambling, use of alcohol and drugs, ragging and eve-teasing are strictly prohibited in the college and such actions, if noticed are punishable under the government norms.
20. Students' Attendance will be monitored by calculating the percentage of class attended by individual student, every end of the month.
21. Students with less than 75% attendance will not allowed writing Semester Exam conducted by the University.
22. If the individual student remains absent for more than five days a month will have to pay Rs 20/Per day as absent fee.(paying Rs 20/- a day will not at any cost will help in getting the attendance for writing the exam)
23. College provides laptops, display screen, LCD, etc. White Screen boards are installed in each class to enable the Lecturer as well as students to help them in the power point presentations or for any other purpose. In case of any damage to these items ,necessary action will be taken by the committee members.
24. Any of the above listed offences attracts a mandatory punching of the identity card by the **Disciplinary Committee Members**. If the number of punches reaches (3) three, then he/she shall be automatically rusticated from the college
